## ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

## BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore Excursions are available on a first-come, first served basis. Guests should note that some shore excursions are very popular with guests and often ending up being waitlisted. In order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via [my.silversea.com](http://my.silversea.com) until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate in excursions are subject to availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge Desk within the cancellation deadline. For our selected Shore Excursions Tickets returned after the cancellation deadline will be charged 100% cancellation fee to the guest's onboard account. Cancellation deadlines for the majority of our shore excursions is 48hrs prior to the port of call. Please note that certain shore excursions might have a different cancellation deadline; all cancellation deadlines are stated in the please note section of the shore excursion, booking form and shore excursion tickets.

## ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. ## SHORE EXCURSION SUITABILITY

Silversea offers a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. However, certain excursions are more appropriate for physically fit and active guests. All excursions offered are clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. We also offer a good variety of Accesible Shore Excursion worldwide (according to the ports availability and local structure) that are designed for guests unable to negotiate motor coach steps or for full time wheelchair/scooter users. The vehicle used on this type of shore excursion is adapted with an access ramp (or lift where available) to accommodate a limited number of mobility devices. In order to use the ramp and/or lift, guests are required to be seated on a wheelchair or scooter. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain to select excursions that meet your physical capability. We therefore encourage guests to review the excursion description carefully including the PLEASE NOTE section which includes useful information. Silversea also offers Destination Experience

## DESTINATION EXPERIENCE BRIEFINGS

Throughout the voyage the Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant will offer port and shore excursion information prior to arrival in each port of call. Their aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and answer as many of your questions as possible. The information is presented in the theatre or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system, and will allow more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port.

## SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicles. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

## CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. Children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment. Such harnesses' and secure

seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately, guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

## VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY CHARGES

Please note that photography at some museums, sites and monuments and/or the use of video cameras may not be allowed or may incur a charge. #### **Hilo, Volcano Winery, Breath-Taking Panoramic Views, Guided Tour**

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive to the Volcano Winery. Located on the Big Island, the Volcano Winery is America's southernmost winery. Upon arrival, take a guided tour of the winery, a unique producer that draws inspiration from volcanic fire and the bounty of the island. What makes this winery even more unique is its high elevation, perched approximately 4,000 feet (about 1,219 metres) above sea level in the middle of volcano country, and the breath-taking panoramic views of your surrounds.

#### **Production Process, Outdoor Tented Area, Premium Wine Tasting, Tea, Local Specialities**

During your guided tour, see and learn how tropical fruits, including the yellow guava and exotic jaborcaba berry, are blended with traditional wine grapes, and transformed into vibrant creations that capture the playful spirit of Hawaiian paradise. Of course, no Volcano Winery tour would be complete without a tasting of their premium wines and chilled estate tea, which are paired with gourmet cheese and crackers and served under an outdoor tented area. At the conclusion of your visit, browse the gift shoppe for a souvenir of your visit, then re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

#### **Hilo, Lili'uokalani Gardens, 'Akaka Falls State Park, Waterfalls**

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 75-minute drive to 'Akaka Falls State Park via the lovely Liliuokalani Gardens. Upon arrival at the park, take an approximately one-mile (about 1.6-kilometre) walk along a natural pathway that traverses the lush, tropical rainforest en route to the iconic Akaka Falls, which cascade down approximately 442 feet (about 135 metres) over a volcanic cliff and offer spectacular photo opportunities.

#### **Pana'ewa Rainforest Zoo, Abundant Flora & Fauna**

Upon arrival, indulge in a tasting of hand-made Hawaiian treats, and browse for local treats and souvenirs in their gift shoppe. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Following your visit, re-board your coach and head to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park.

### **Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, Kilauea & Mauna Loa Summits,**

A designated International Biosphere Reserve and UNESCO World Heritage Site, Hawaii Volcanoes National Park protects some of the most unique geological, biological, and cherished cultural landscapes in the world. Hawaii Volcanoes National Park extends from sea level to approximately 13,680 feet (about 4,170 metres) and encompasses the summits of two of the world's most active volcanoes, Kilauea and Mauna Loa. Upon arrival at Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, take a guided walking tour.

### **Tropical Rainforest, Kilauea Crater & Volcano, , Visitors Centre, Museum**

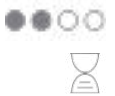

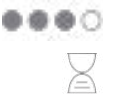

After a photo stop here, re-board your coach and drive through a spectacular tree-tunnel to Hawaii's sacred Mauna 'Ala (Royal Mausoleum), the final resting place of six of the kingdom's last eight ruling monarchs. Royal history would not be complete without understanding the role Christian missionaries played in shaping the islands. Transfer to the Hawaiian Mission Houses Historic Site & Archives (HMH) for a guided tour of three restored houses, two of which are the oldest houses in Hawaii. Along



the way, learn about the research archives which provide a unique glimpse into 19th-century Hawaii, both on-site and online. HMH was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1965.

### **Kawaiahao Church, King Kamehameha Statue, Iolani Palace**

# Vancouver - Canada

### VAN-A / Vancouver City and Airport Transfer

Vancouver's Chinatown is the third largest of its kind in North America, and home to more than 30,000 people of Chinese descent. Authentic architecture, exotic cuisine, and colorful specialty shops make each turn down the narrow alleyways a unique adventure.

Drive through Gastown, the original site from which modern Vancouver evolved. The varied shops and boutiques make the area a popular shopping district. The famous steam clock fills the air with music every 15 minutes.

Stanley Park is a lush rainforest in the heart of the city. This 1,000-acre park teems with wildlife and natural beauty. The park was created in 1889 and is named after the Governor General of Canada (who was also responsible for the Stanley Cup Hockey Tournament). Stanley Park houses an aquarium, rose garden, cricket fields, an open-air theatre and the First Nations Totem Poles. The thousand-acre park is bound by a three-mile (4.8-kilometre) seawall, which also serves as a bike path.

Granville Island, once an industrial area, is now home to craft studios, artists galleries, theatres, a brewery and a public market featuring handcrafted products, unique gifts and street performers. Many of the buildings have retained their original timber beams and tin roofs.

Continue to the airport for your flight home.
